Searching for a place that offers restoration is a daily hardship for the members of our community impacted by homelessness. The Sharing Center sets out to lighten this heavy burden through The Oasis, our respite center sharing essential services – hot showers, laundry services, mail accessibility, fresh meals, and haircuts. All of which, no one should have to go without.

Over 9,109 of these services have been shared this year. Since the unveiling of the new home of The Oasis in July, we have seen an 11.6% increase from last year. With a greater need in our community and with the incredible partnerships of Heart of Florida United Way, AdventHealth, Wharton-Smith, Orlando Health, Miles To Go Charities, and the Three Sixteen Charitable Foundation, we expanded our center to maximize our impact. Today, we are able to share with more than double the number of guests we ever have at the Live United Village.

Our updated facility truly captures the heart of our mission – to serve others with dignity and compassion. Every day, our guests are welcomed to a space that provides a welcoming atmosphere and allows us to cater to the individual needs of each guest. Private office areas have allowed our case managers to dedicate more time to each guest, one-on-one, when serving as a guide and mentor towards financial stability and economic mobility.

Regardless of the hardship faced, The Oasis's services care for the whole-being of the individual. It continues to be a place for those who are experiencing a season of their lives without a home.

ProjectRISE Creating Paths to Possibilities

ProjectRISE is our newest initiative, a workforce development program developed to support those who are under-employed or unemployed, homeless or housed. During the four-week program, participants focus on the curriculum to grow emotional intelligence, critical thinking, and the necessary soft skills to regain financial stability and economic mobility. Local businesses give their time and talents to help participants prepare for the workforce by conducting mock interviews and resume-writing workshops.

"ProjectRISE has blessed me with stability, not only in shelter but knowing that if I needed someone to speak to or simply guidance, I can always contact a staff member," said Samantha, a ProjectRISE graduate from the program's second cohort. The impact made by ProjectRISE goes beyond employment and the standard professional trainings with the help of facilitators that embody our values of sharing compassion through life's mounting pressures.

Samantha and Britton are among the graduates who received job offers from our local partners and are moving towards achieving their professional goals while overcoming personal hardships.

Critical thinking and emotional intelligence are crucial skills when navigating long-term stability, yet they are among the skills that get lost in the gap for our underserved neighbors. By taking the time to strengthen each individual's soft skills, ProjectRISE is promoting lasting results and a path for participants to follow when working towards a life-long dream that previously seemed out of reach.

Before our items are rehomed at The Village Shoppes (the Thrift, Boutique, and Furniture stores) our volunteers and team members at the Distribution Center work faithfully to sort, inspect, and test each donated item. This detail and dedication are crucial to our efforts. Revenue generated from The Village Shoppes goes back into our programs to provide essential resources to families and individuals in our community who are experiencing hunger and homelessness. The reach of our Thrift Program does not end there. Fill-A-Trucks are the newest addition to our retail program. This model allows us to visit our local communities to pick up donations to bring back to our Distribution Center. Since introducing Fill-A-Truck at the Lake Forest Community, we have hosted 18 Fill-A-Trucks this year in 11 different communities. By expanding our reach and visiting the communities that are eager to serve, we are able to amplify our impact.

With a family of 5,440 volunteers at the heart of every service, our mission is carried out with the helping hands of seasoned volunteers, newcomers, and young helpers from across Central Florida. This past year, we saw new levels of kindness from our community with more than **50,469 hours shared**, an equivalent of **\$1.5 million** in in-kind services donated!

In an effort to meet people where they are, we launched #HashtagLunchbag. This international movement is dedicated to empowering and inspiring humanity to reap the benefits of giving. Members of the community of all ages shared their time and energy. We believe no one deserves to endure the uncertainties of not knowing where their next meal will come from.

By adopting this initiative, The Sharing Center conducted #HashtagLunchbag events throughout the year to assemble hundreds of sandwich lunch bags that were then distributed around the area to homeless camps, shelters, and supportive housing units.

Exploring Poverty Summit

According to Heart of Florida United Way's ALICE Report, nearly half of Florida's population is facing the harsh realities of being one setback away from poverty and homelessness.

With a mission to spread awareness and thoroughly investigate the underlying issues of poverty, food insecurity, and homelessness, The Sharing Center launched our inaugural Exploring Poverty Summit at the beginning of 2022.

During the summit, thought leaders and advocates from across Central Florida gathered to discuss the important conversations highlighting affordable housing, job accessibility, education, and the climbing pressures affecting our neighbors.

Together, we can unite and alleviate the burdens of poverty, but progress is not possible without informing and educating our community. The event's speakers and activities were designed to teach attendees that anyone – secretaries, firefighters, and CEOs alike – can be a changemaker for those who need it most.
